## Olympic Silver Medalist is visiting Holy Trinity next week....

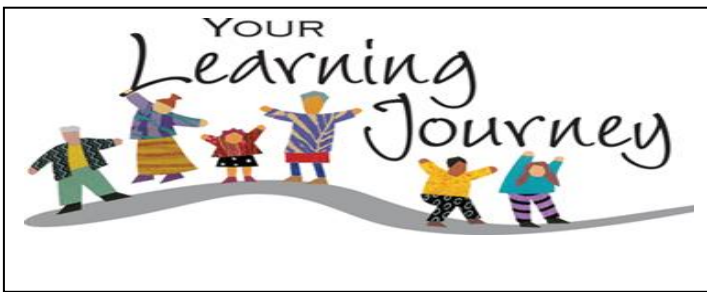
